that they wanted...I did agree, they probably wanted to get rid of Senator Chambers. The other thing that I heard...and I've just mentioned it to Senator Chambers, and he kind of laughed about it. One of the other things that I was told over and over again, the problem with you senators that have been there so long, you introduce too many bills. And I said, well, that's what we're up there for, is to deal with bills. Yeah, but you introduce too many, and if we can rid of some of you, the new senators don't seem to introduce so many bills. Well, if that's their thinking, then I guess we have to go with that. But I just tried to gain, in my time on the...as I visited with people and as I walked the streets and talked to people, why they were so much in favor of term limits. And I found out. But I think they were wrong. I think they're wrong today. I think that this idea that's been brought forth is something we ought to pursue. I agree that if we don't do it right now, we probably should wait a little while and, as Senator Chambers said, take a little time to see what the people are thinking out there, and in fact if they can be changed and, secondly, figure out some way to keep all that outside money from coming in here to provide the kind of funds. I have to tell you, as I went to the post office, and I live in a little town, and there was a lady standing out there with a petition, asked me to sign it. And I said, what for? Interestingly enough, she wasn't even for sure why, except that somebody had given it to her and told her she got two dollars for every...after I talked to her for about 15 minutes, she finally acknowledged that she was getting two dollars for every name she got signed on that petition. Is that the way we run this government? I think not. And so the bottom line is, I hope we can advance this piece of legislation.
