this will at least give them a chance to re-look at their decision, and perhaps they might want to make a wiser one. So with that, I would certainly like to see you advance this amendment. And right now, I'd like to turn my spare time, or the time I have left, I'm sorry, over to Senator Bromm if he'd like to use it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bromm.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Engel. And thank you, Senator Tyson, for allowing this bill to be used for this purpose. You receive all kinds of communication as senators. And I've found since having the privilege of being Speaker that I receive additional communication as well. And I just want to tell you that in the last six months I have received a considerable amount of communication from, I think, pretty representative groups of this state who are interested in getting behind this effort in the next several months, if you are all willing to put this bill in a position where it has a reasonable chance of passage before next spring or fall. So I think if we feel that we can put this bill in a position where it has a chance to pass, that we will begin to hear from groups who are willing to organize and try to put together some resources to counteract the out-of-state resources, which will be tremendous again in trying to retain term limits. So for that reason and many others that have been discussed today, I would simply ask for your support to advance the bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm and Senator Engel. The question before the body is adoption of AM0783, offered by the Exec Board to LB 598. All in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the adoption of AM0783, Exec Board committee amendments to LB 598. Have you all voted who care to? Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.
