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these things would do and what the attitude of the body may be, before I make any more comments. And with that, Mr. Speaker, thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, the Chairman of the Appropriations Committee and I were just talking. And this is my...he doesn't know anything about this. This is my offer to the body. You all just go home for two weeks, turn the appropriations side over to Senator Wehrbein, turn the revenue side over to me, and when you all come back in two weeks, we will have something. And it will be so alluring, so coherent, so logical, so lacking in competitiveness, that everybody will say, well, why didn't we do this sooner? And then Senator Wehrbein and I will just shrug our shoulders. We don't know. But that's not going to happen, so let me go back to what I was talking about earlier. I get along very well with Walt, and I've known him for a lot of years. So I don't want anybody to misunderstand what I've said, and especially Walt. It would be unfair for me to attack him on this floor, and he doesn't have access to the floor. Although with the access he has to the senators, I'm sure he could get them to suspend their rules and allow him to address the Legislature, which we have the authority under the rules to do. But I would oppose that. Walt does his job, and he does it well. Walt is a master at what he does. I just wish I could do with the legislators what Walt does for them. Here's what I would say. I respect Walter Radcliffe for what he does. If he and I were both fencing masters, and we had a contest, I won't tell you how it would come out, but I would make that fencer's salute. I would hold my blade horizontally...well, perpendicular, straight up in front of my face, and I would say one word to Walt Radcliffe: maestro. Now, he can take that to his clients and get more money. And then he'll come back here and lash you all even harder. Somebody said...I think it may have been Solomon...your fathers whipped...lashed you with whips; I'll lash you with scorpions. He didn't mean those little critters that you find running around in Arizona, one of which bit my granddaughter, but she was taken to the hospital in time and everything was taken care of. A scorpion was a three-pronged whip. And they
