And so for that reason, I would ask you to support the return for this specific amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Vrtiska. Any further discussion on the motion to return, specific amendment? Seeing no lights on, Senator Bromm, did you wish to close?

SPEAKER BROMM: Only to say this, Senator. I have been impressed with the plans that have been explained to me by the Workers' Compensation Court and information that they will be providing to employers once this becomes law, hopefully that it does. I think they have good plans to provide information that will help employers know when they will reach that line or that threshold and what they need to do when they reach it, and that should be helpful to all of those who...and we all do have constituents who will be affected by it. So with that, I'd ask you to return the bill. Thank you.
