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another area of a possible compromise. I think we pretty much can agree on the personal vehicle, but it was also brought to my attention that farm trucks would not be covered under that. So we would make it specific to personal vehicles and farm trucks and that would cover the farm vehicles and help for the rural folks. It would include the passenger vehicles that would include everybody, and it would be everybody equally, whatever their status was, be they wealthy or be they of more modest means. So at this point, that is really the intent of what I was trying to get at, was that personal passenger vehicle. I wasn't intending to do every motorized vehicle, but when we had it drafted by Bill Drafters it was just very easy to change "include" to "exclude" and use the existing definition of motor vehicle. At this point, I think we can, unless someone has some questions, limit the amendment, AM1831, to those personal passenger vehicles and truck, farm trucks, and it should reduce the impact of the fiscal note on the bill, but it would get at the heart of what I'm attempting to do and those vehicles that I'm attempting to exclude out. The other aspect, the five-year component, I'm open to that, and if that's an area where we can compromise, I'm willing to do that as well. So at this point, some discussion and to get a sense of where the body is with that is what I'd like to do now, and then if the body is agreeable to that we can introduce that amendment to my amendment and move on from this component. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I've talked to Senator Preister and his limiting the reach of this amendment to passenger vehicles and those pickups, or what he calls farm trucks, would not be objectionable to me. However, I do want to touch on the broader issue. Either we need Senator Landis' bill to raise the tax on alcohol, or everything is going to be put in Senator Brashear's bill, which will be vetoed if an increase in the income tax is there. I believe there should be. I don't know that a combination of factors can be put into one bill and draw 30 votes that would hold together after a Governor's veto. I don't see any way to avoid a special session, but I'm trying to lay out some of the
