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teachers because you still have to supply the services. And I would ask Senator Pedersen if he would respond to a couple of questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Pedersen, would you respond to a question of Senator Tyson?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Yes, Senator.

SENATOR TYSON: Senator Pedersen, have you...is this, your number, the result of a model constructed so as to show what the tentative savings would be?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: I don't think I understand your question, Senator.

SENATOR TYSON: Well, if you remove X number of people from a facility, you don't have to clothe them, feed them, medicate them, et cetera, and those you can use average numbers on. However, if you were to take a facility and say we're going to remove, pick a figure, 20 percent of the inmates, you would not reduce the staff by any at all. So my question is has there been a pro forma constructed to show that these figures are reasonable and prudent?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Senator, this amendment closes an entire facility, staff, inmates, and everything. So you don't have to keep anybody there. There would probably be a skeleton crew that could come out of the work release center to do detail to make sure that the buildings are taken care of until such time they would need it again or have some other use for it. But it closes the entire...this particular institution.

SENATOR TYSON: You yourself, Senator Pedersen, noted that there are...this is not a static population. There are people being released today and there are people coming in today. Is that accounted for in this?

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: This, yes, it would be. I mean we would have to keep up parole where we are presently even after giving up the 500 inmates. We would have to keep up our current parole
