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the fullest and reach our greatest potential. Maybe the next generation will become the grandest generation. Let's give them the opportunity.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JOHNSON: As opposed to my good friend Senator Schrock, he's right, but I'm going to compromise and I'm going to recommend and I'm going to vote for this amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Johnson. Senator Cunningham, on the Raikes amendment.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members. Could I ask Senator Raikes a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes, are you available? Senator Raikes is not...Senator Raikes is coming in. Senator Raikes, would you respond?

SENATOR RAIKES: Yes.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Senator Raikes, do you know how this affects the schools that have already had a levy override? Would they be able to use this extra four or five cents, do you know? Do you know how that would work?

SENATOR RAIKES: It's a good question, Senator. This particular amendment, either one of those don't deal directly with that issue, but the issue that you raise is relevant. It depends, I think, specifically on how the override motion, if you will, or ballot language was done. And the question as I...that I understand you're asking is that we've now got a dollar levy lid. If there's an override in place then, say, a school district might be able to go to \$1.20 with a vote of the people. So the question is, would it be 20 cents over what is the current levy lid? So if you changed the levy lid to \$1.04 or \$1.05, would that mean the override levy lid would be \$1.24 or \$1.25? Or would the levy lid stay at \$1.20 even if you raise the levy lid to \$1.04 or \$1.05, as the case may be? And I think the...I don't want to take too much of your time, but it hinges
