on the ballot language. In my understanding, that is in some school districts in override elections the offering or advertisement was made that if this override passes the levy will not be higher than \$1.20. That was the offering or the advertisement, if you will. So I would assume in that case that increasing the levy lid would not affect that...the maximum levy allowed. On the other hand, if the advertisement was that the levy would not be more than 20 cents over the maximum levy lid authorized by the state, then I would think that the school district would have the possibility to go the extra 4 or 5 cents.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you. Do we have any idea how many schools across the state aren't going to be able to use this 4 or 5 cents if necessary? I mean, are a lot of them going to be barred from doing this and then it's just going to be a big cut in state aid that's going to severely hamper them?

SENATOR RAIKES. If you're talking about override districts then I'll have to get...I'll get that information for you, Senator. I think there are something on the order of 30 to 50 districts...systems around the state that have done overrides and for some, but not all, of those they would be approaching that limit on the override. So I can't answer your question. I will try to get some information on that for you.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Okay. Thank you, Senator Raikes. I believe I'm just going to sit and listen to the discussion. I'm not sure where I'm going to be on this amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Senator Kremer, on the Raikes amendment to AM1881.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members of the body. I'm sitting here trying to listen and my mind is going a lot of different directions trying to figure out what I'd like to do on this. I think it is going to be definitely a cut to the University of Nebraska, or the university system, and the community colleges.
