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to determine whether we're going to have a fair determination here or not. And there...Senator Smith may be a little bit upset, but there are...but that's a necessary thing, I think, and in addition to that, many of us have voted for a great number of revenue issues that are in support of low-income and the poor and help everything be fair. Others of us on this legislative floor have rarely or never voted for income revenue measures that help us fund these types of things that we're talking about right in this moment of time, and maybe both of those things should be considered at this time. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President and members. If Senator Beutler would yield to a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure.

SENATOR SMITH: Was the increase in the funding, that I'm not attacking here, but did the increase in funding of \$400,000 that goes to one of the centers in Omaha, was that brought in the form of a bill and had its own hearing and so forth?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I was not at that particular hearing, so I can't tell you what occurred at that particular point in time.

SENATOR SMITH: If Senator Thompson could respond.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Thompson, would you respond to a question?

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes.

SENATOR SMITH: Same question. Did that \$400,000 have its own bill and hearing and so forth?

SENATOR THOMPSON: What the...the issue that came up, and there
