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SENATOR MOSSEY: Exactly.

SENATOR THOMPSON: There wasn't a way to get to it except to put the amendment back in or keep it in law that it's split 70/30 because of the way the bill was...came to our committee. And our committee discussed it and we weren't comfortable passing an amendment. Nobody made...offered a motion to keep the funding split at 70/30. So rather go than 50/50, the discussion was to add to equalize them.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Okay. Thank you. Because I think it's a...to recognize the excellent service they do provide there and a lot of doctors do pro bono work and a lot of excellent doctors do contribute back to the community. Thank you for answering that. I would yield...how much remaining time do I have, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: About two minutes, Senator.

SENATOR MOSSEY: I would yield the rest of my time to Senator Smith.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President and members. I will point out that the motion in committee was to make two clinics in Omaha whole at \$700,000 apiece, and if you wanted to compare the same numbers that would be zero for the Panhandle. But I'll use some of those dollars, to the tune of \$164,000, even though there are more restrictions. They ultimately come from the same source, but there are more restrictions because there wasn't any wording in statute that said that the money would go directly to Panhandle Community Services, for example, that serves 11 counties of the Panhandle. And we're talking roughly the same numbers of people coming for a visit and needing the health services. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith and Senator Mossey. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion of the reconsideration motion by Senator Smith, Senator Brown, followed by Senator Thompson.
