deal with the other federally qualified health clinics and the look-alikes, but the way it's structured now, 2nd Congressional goes only to the federal...money goes directly to the health clinics. The way this would be structured is the clinics in other areas would now get a direct or possibly a direct appropriation also, but we still have the grant fund that's set up for those two congressional districts. And that's why you're getting a little confused here. Now I'm sure in the first...in the 2nd Congressional District there are health departments and there are other providers who would have liked to had a shot at the money also. In fact, I heard from a couple of them, but that was not what the Legislature did at that point in time. It was treated differently, but that's just the way it is. I think if we're going to change the way we're treating all the federally qualified health centers and the grant fund, we probably need more time with it. It's difficult to do at this point. And I give Senator Smith every consideration in terms of fighting for what he believes should be right and how it should be structured, but I think it's going to be difficult to pull that together here on the floor because it has implications for the other providers to minority health in the other two congressional districts. And it's easier in the 2nd Congressional District because we're a very concentrated population area. You can drive through and you're not going to see any space. I mean, you won't know when you leave one city and go to the next, if you didn't have city signs. It's going to look like one...it's one big metropolitan area. And the clinics serve where a lot of the populations live or have bus access to for people who need these services in north and south Omaha, and it is 98 percent minority. It's spread out a little differently in the other congressional districts and, as a result, I really think...and I understand what Senator Smith is trying to do for this facility, but I think with more time we can work on it and come back next year, and I know no senator ever likes to hear that, but I think it's just difficult to do and work out on the floor. And we did discuss this in committee. The issues came up early on. I was contacted by people from the north Omaha clinic because of the way the bill was structured and a concern that the 50/50 split was going to harm their services. It's been talked about maybe more to our committees--Health and Human Services, and Appropriations--and
