inequity. And yet, you take communities that aren't along the interstate or aren't big trade centers; they don't do so well. So, Senator Bromm, with that I would yield my time to you, if you want it, so you can continue your conversation with Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BAKER: Senator Bromm, would you like the time?

SPEAKER BROMM: How much time is there, Mr. President?

SENATOR BAKER: Nearly four minutes.

SPEAKER BROMM: Oh, yes. Thank you, Senator Schrock. I would like to continue this just a little bit further. Cities can only do, of course, what we authorize them to do, as a creature of statute. But once we've allowed them to do something, by virtue of a vote of their people, then I just cannot fathom how we could take the money from the city coffers. It comes through the state because we collect the sales tax, and then we send it back to them. But to say, oh, there's a caveat on the sales tax authority that we gave you, and that is that when you levy your sales tax now and you receive more because we've expanded the base to automobile repairs or whatever, then we're going to withhold that from you, or we're going to withhold your aid if you get aid, whichever is the least, I think, if I'm correct. So that, to me, ...I think some city somewhere is going to challenge this, and I think we're going to find ourselves defending ourselves in court. And I think it is a legal issue. The ability to spend the money that you levy and tax...I think the ability to spend that money lies with the people in the subdivision that levied the tax, just as it would be for a county, with a county levy. The second thing that I'm struggling with is the workability. I don't...Senator Landis, would you yield to a question or two? Senator Landis, when cities collect sales tax, is there a method by which they keep track of what is collected by virtue of what item, other than automobiles versus other things? Is there...if they collect "X" amount from repairs of automobiles, versus the sale of some other item, would that be identifiable?

SENATOR BAKER: Senator Landis, would you respond, please?
