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is no longer needed. And I'd like us to be able to ask what closing the Lincoln Correctional Center really means, in terms of programming, in terms of staffing, in terms of overcrowding, in terms of parole, in terms of security, and in terms of actual dollar savings. And I'd like for us to be able to discuss that and be able to share some additional information beyond what we had last night. Now, you'll notice that I've filed three more amendments on this bill. And one of them would close the Norfolk Regional Center, and one of them would close the Hastings Regional Center, and one of them would close the Correctional Center for Women at York. It makes just as much sense to bring those up at the last minute and close them as it does the Lincoln Correctional Center. In fact, we'd save more money in any of those instances, I believe, if we did one of those others. I don't think that our process is one that makes these kinds of rash decisions. And I also don't think we make them because we don't happen to agree with the way a certain institution is run. I think it's our job to see that those institutions are well run and that we get the best bang for our bucks. A couple of things I'd like to share with you this afternoon. First of all, Tecumseh has a full complement of staff, I have been told. There are 2,200 employees in the state correctional division. Right now they have 60 vacancies, which is probably about normal, because you always have turnover. What that means is, those 265 employees that are at the Lincoln Correctional Center cannot necessarily be absorbed into the whole. However, I'll tell you later that we may need to transfer some of those anyway, because of certain programming that's done at the Lincoln Correctional Center. So then you're going to have to be probably letting go some at other centers. Last night, the figure \$11 million was talked about as a savings if we would do this. And later in the evening, that was changed to maybe \$7.5 million that we would save if we close the center. And then we did talk about the fact that there are very special things at the Lincoln Correctional Center that provide for the Diagnostic and Evaluation Center, which is in close proximity. And you're going to have to provide those services to the Diagnostic Center even if you don't have the Lincoln Correctional Center. For instance, you're going to have to provide food. So you're going to have to have probably an addition to...eventually, to the Diagnostic Center, of some kind
