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counties first. Senator Janssen and Senator Cunningham will be aware that when we were talking about these cards that could be used in place of food stamps, they were tried on a spot here, in a spot here, and a spot there. And we never do it all of a sudden. If the Governor came in with a proposal to shut down an institution, we would do it over a period of time. So because we adopted an amendment of Senator Don Pederson that showed discretion being exercised, it becomes a basis for condemnation and a challenge to just shut it down right now. Well, we're not crazy. And we're not going to let the Governor or his spokespersons on the floor or off the floor get us to take action that is ill-considered. This summer, or the interim, which will go beyond the summer, the legislative...the Legislature's Judiciary Committee is going to have an interim study. All the information that people claim to have can be accepted in that forum. Nothing is taking place before October of next year. There is no need for anybody here to panic. And the Governor was absolutely irresponsible and bordering on being a liar when he suggested that we're going to turn loose 500 people to be your neighbors. No responsible governor would make a comment like that. He's playing to the fears of people, is deliberately misrepresenting what we did, misrepresenting the consequences of what we did. And if we as a Legislature are going to let that foolishness cause us to turn away from a decision that we discussed at great length and in great detail before making, we'll indeed cause the Legislature to be a source of ridicule...or, a target of ridicule. And it should be. We knew what we were doing. Now that that was done, the Governor's Office suddenly comes up and says, well, we know where some money can be cut from corrections. Well, where were they before this action was taken? And I guarantee you that there are people in corrections saying, we'll change some of those practices that Chambers and others were talking about on the floor. And you know why the Governor's Office came up with money, and why they will change those policies? Because for the first time, the Legislature did something as a Legislature to address the problems in corrections. We have been critical on the floor, critical in committee hearings. But we have never taken action to back up what we talked about. The only way we have made any progress is by that decision we made last night. It was valid then. It is valid now.
