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come out and talk to him. He has found a place that will help him get started, thank God. He's got no supervision. He had nothing to eat on. I gave him five dollars for lunch yesterday in the cafeteria. He came to me and asked for some help. And I'll be glad to help anybody in that way.

SENATOR BAKER: Time.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: But he is not mandated to do anything. Thank you.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Pedersen. (Visitors introduced.) Senator Wehrbein, you're next to be recognized.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President, members. My position today is the same as it was yesterday. I was opposed to Senator Pedersen's amendment. So I urge you to reconsider this. It's very alluring, if you will, very enticing, to take this up. And I understand that. Corrections...I don't want to exaggerate, but I would guess our committee has talked about this 1,000 times (laugh) in our committee over the years, as we've watched our correction budgets go up. And I understand the desire to do something. I know, one hand the public will tell you to cut corrections, and they will tell you on the other hand, don't you dare let out the criminals. And so this is one of those areas that it appears that we can do something. I don't think that this is a way to do it. And that's why I would encourage you to reconsider the vote. Perhaps we need to look at early paroles. I encourage that. And I would...I know Senator Pedersen is going to do the study, and I think that's appropriate. And certainly, other states are letting out parolees early. And I think that's a consideration. But I think the ramifications that Senator Schimek brought up about the multi-use of LCC in terms of food service and many of those things that are part of LCC and carry out in the rest of the prison system, are something we can't take lightly, and something that certainly negates quite a bit of the savings that are implied here. If you really want some savings, there are possibly some other areas that we could get it. My sense is, this is the issue here, is to do something about slowing down the corrections budget more than it is actually saving this
