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have to deal with the burgeoning costs in this area. It is unfortunate that the way that we have...are doing it is pretty precipitous. I think that was a word that was used last night. And it is. But we...I have extraordinary faith in our Judiciary Committee. They have shown over and over and over again a willingness to grapple with issues and to make situations that were not good better. And I am willing to let this stand the way it is, because I am willing to put it in their hands. And if they come back and say, this is ridiculous, we cannot do this, next year, then we will fix it, and we will have time to fix it. But it is...even though it's not the method that I might have chosen, or the approach that I would have chosen, it has put on the table in a very real way that we have to deal with some of these issues. And so my unwillingness to reconsider it...to reconsider what we did last night, even though I didn't support it, is less an endorsement of the motion that I didn't vote for last night, and more an endorsement of our Judiciary Committee, and what I think...how I think that they will handle this issue about incarceration rates, who is incarcerated, who and how they may be released, what our parole system looks like. And Senator Schimek made reference several times to not wanting to have certain types of individuals released. That really...we have to have the structure, we have to have faith in our parole process. And a lot of things that...and if there are policy considerations that need to be changed, I look to our Judiciary Committee for those recommendations. But I don't think that the sky is falling yet. And I would yield some time to Senator Brashear if he would like it.

SENATOR BAKER: Senator Brashear, would you like the time? There's a minute and fifteen seconds.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you.

SENATOR BAKER: Senator Brashear waives. Thank you, Senator Brown. Senator Tyson.
