the level and the point that we did this morning. And if we...I think if we start to alter what we agreed to, which Senator Schrock didn't vote for, and that's another reason why he's perfectly willing to offer this and free to offer this, but I would feel that I'd...in my...in my word, I would be in...to some extent, going back against what I worked to try to accomplish this morning. That was a sacrifice on many parts to get to that point and if Senator Schrock can produce more money into the General Fund to help close the gap, I applaud him for that. However, I think there are some special considerations when we start going into funds like either the Tobacco Trust Fund or the Highway Trust Fund. Those funds we have tried to set aside and I think we can compliment ourselves for maintaining some discipline in the past for maintaining the integrity of those funds. We've got more needs in the economic development road, whatever you want to call it, area, and I know, Senator Johnson, you've got a need in your district that you have testified to that would require a substantial amount of road money, and I have a vision that someday, if the voters of this state would ever decide that they wanted to approve casino gambling in this state, and if there were one in your part of the state, the amount of traffic and revenue that would be generated would go a long ways towards accomplishing some of the goals that I think you would like to do in terms of changing the road potential and the intersection potential in your district. But if we're going to start violating trust funds that are so important to the infrastructure of this state, whether it be the health infrastructure or the road infrastructure, then we've got a long...a longer ways to go in this session than I thought we had. I've had a sense that even though we're not there yet we're starting to make some decisions that are helpful in arriving at a two-year budget, and changing what we did this morning, and I think this does that, would go a ways towards arriving at a solution so...against not arriving at a solution and putting another roadblock for us to try to overcome. So I can't support the amendment. I do not fault Senator Schrock for bringing it. He needs to present it as he would like, but I myself am not going to be able to support it. Thank you, Mr. President.
