1 percent additional budget growth. They have the option of using unused budget authority. They have the option of interlocal agreements, which fall outside the budget lid, the restricted spending. And they also have additional spending authority that may be given them if they are a low-spending school. So all of those things would allow them to increase their budget above and beyond the 0 percent, if you will. But even the 0 percent does not mean that spending has to be reduced as compared to the previous year. There's not a mandate that that be done. Now, certainly, if a school...a local school board examines their situation and decides that's what they want to do, they certainly could do that. But we at the...in the Legislature, would not be requiring them to do that.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay. Thank you. That...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: ...fairly well answers my question. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuthman. Senator Stuhr, followed by Senators Engel, Louden, and Vrtiska, on the motion to return. Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I support the motion to return to Select File. As many of you, it was not an easy thing to do yesterday to vote for those reductions to education, not only higher education, but also K through 12. I do feel that giving the authority, the extra cent, as we voted on yesterday, will help those schools that need it. Last year, I believe about half of the schools tried to make up that difference in the state aid that was lost. And we don't know. Because every school situation is a different situation. As an ag producer, of course this will be a shift. Or if you are a homeowner, this will be a shift. But I think it's important that we do provide an opportunity for those schools to maintain as much quality as they can. And I will turn the rest of my time back to Senator Raikes, if he wants to make some additional comments. Thank you.
