I'm surprised that those people have not jumped up who talked about how sacred the so-called Highway Trust Fund is. Since the users are taxed, as they said, to bring that money into the Highway Trust Fund, it ought to be expended only in making the highways safer. We're talking about the future of our society, the safety of our children when we talk about highways. Well, if the money raised from users should go only to create safe highways, the money raised from the users of tobacco should go to promote the health of this society and fight against the ravages of tobacco. Someday I hope some of the young people watching us today will realize that they should not just think about growing up and voting for the right person, they should think about growing up and becoming the right person who will be in this Legislature and will take positions that will make the world better for the little children following them after they become adults as we should do now as adults. Senator Smith mentioned that if somebody dies from cancer, that should not be a basis for our formulating a policy. I have heard many people say that if a particular piece of legislation saves one person that justifies it. We're talking about thousands of people, thousands of young people, and we just...

SENATOR ENGEL: One minute.

If we do not adopt this amendment, I think it will be a shameful dereliction on the part of this Legislature, and it should be done in the presence of the great crowd of witnesses sitting in the balcony watching their representatives tell them that their future health is not important. Fixing streets and roads is more important than giving them an opportunity to live a healthful existence, to make it possible for their relatives to be rescued from the ravages of smoking. I know not what course others may take, but as for me, I'm going to vote for Senator Bromm's amendment, and I hope anybody who has a shred...
