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either. If somebody is doing a project, they can start with the assumption they are going to owe sales tax because we're collecting sales tax on this service now. But it's certainly worth their time, if they increase the value of the property by 100 percent or more,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...they would be extremely foolish in my view to not be happy to keep track of the sales tax they pay, and file for the refund that the law would provide is due them. And we do that in other areas of tax law. So it's their project. They get the increased value. They pay the sales tax. And when they can prove that it improved it by more than 100 percent or more, they file a refund and they get their money back. Why wouldn't they want to?

SENATOR JENSEN: Senator Brashear, have you ever had a remodeling of your dwelling? Have you undergone that?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I've not only had a remodeling of my dwelling, but I've had a remodeling of commercial property.

SENATOR JENSEN: Okay.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: A burned out commercial property.

SENATOR JENSEN: All right, and have you...did you hire a contractor and did you enter in...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: I did.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...enter into that on a cost-plus basis?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR JENSEN: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Beutler, followed by Senators Stuthman, Raikes, and Brashear. Senator Beutler.
