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a window, if you will, for a contractor that does not have a sales tax number?

SENATOR JENSEN: Well, and that was kind of one of my thoughts as to should a subcontractor, are all subcontractors also going to have a number? And if they do, can they, in their bill, or in their form...or can there be a form...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...that they would submit that would have a line on there?

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay, I'm...I was particularly interested in this because I thought that that was the point that you were making earlier. And wouldn't it be possible for the...suppose I'm the subcontractor and you're the general contractor, if that's the case, on a remodeling project or a repair project that's taxable. It's not over the limit. Then I would charge you sales tax on my labor.

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: And then you could, in effect, avoid then charging that tax to the final consumer, wouldn't that be possible?

SENATOR JENSEN: I would like to see that happen, yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: But don't you understand that that would be possible the way this is set up now, or the way this is proposed?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR JENSEN: I'm not real sure.

SENATOR RAIKES: Okay, thank you, Senator.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Brashear.
