LB 75A (sic), E & R for engrossing. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. The ayes have it. It is advanced. We'll now go to General File special order. Mr. Clerk, first item. Do you have any items for the record, Mr. Clerk? I'm sorry.

CLERK: I'm fine, Mr. President, thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Okay. Thank you.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 283, a bill by Senator Landis. (Read title.) The bill has been discussed on May 6. Committee amendments have been adopted, a motion to bracket the bill. Mr. President, the first amendment I have to the bill, Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers would move to strike the emergency clause.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to open on FA1352.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I would like to withdraw that amendment and the immediately following amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: They are both withdrawn. Mr. Clerk, when you get time, the next item to the bill.

CLERK: Senator Landis would move to amend with AM1713. (Legislative Journal page 1611.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis, to open on AM1713 to LB 283.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Clerk and Senator Cudaback. We made a couple of amendments to the Brashear bill that came out of the work of the Revenue Committee and were designed and filed to this bill first, but we didn't get to it. One of them was the delay of the childcare tax credit for a million nine per year. That's a significant piece. Secondly, instead of sending the federal government some estate tax, this would take about \$800,000 and leave that with us. It is either going to leave the state for the federal government, or it's going to stay with us. Those are the only two fates for this \$800,000 per year, and the goal was to put it here. When the body saw these ideas
