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have the opportunity and the time to rectify it. And I had told Senator Stuhr and some others I would do everything I possibly could to help us make this right. And this is what we have come up with. So I do not intend to actually attach it to Senator Bromm's bill, because I don't want to jeopardize it. But I want the opportunity to discuss it. And in case others might have a word or two, I will not pull it right away. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You heard the opening on AM1964. For discussion now, Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker and members. Senator Chambers, I would like to have a clarification.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, would you respond?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes I will.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I had a copy, and I haven't had a chance to get back to my machine. But where you say about 75 percent of any grant received by the state up to \$300,000, there's lots and lots of grants, going into the millions, obviously, to the University of Nebraska. And I would like to have you clarify that you don't mean all grants coming to the University of Nebraska, or you're not including the University of Nebraska in this case of state coming to the money...money coming to the state from the USDA.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's true. And, Senator Wehrbein, as I stated, this is to put the idea before us, so that it will have been before the Legislature for at least five days. And it can be refined, but I wanted there to be enough here to make it clear what it is that I will be attempting to do.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But there will be refinements, and I appreciate you giving me a chance to put that on the record.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you.
