SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Louden on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members of the body. I commend Senator Chambers for doing this amendment such as this, and bringing this to the attention, bringing it out on the floor. And I really like the chance to get this in front of the body so that everyone understands what has taken place, so that at least we can...if we don't get things changed, that at least it can be out in the open what has happened and what has transpired, and hopefully that the right will prevail. We know that it doesn't always prevail, what we consider right. But we have to remember the three sides to every story: their side, our side, and the Truth with a capital "T." I am hoping that our side is the Truth with a capital "T," because I'd like to see that prevail. But hopefully, at least, now this will all be out in the open and we can get it in front of the body and at least have some other opinions weigh in on this subject. And I would give my time to Senator Chambers if he would desire any more.
