SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to ask Senator Bromm a question, if I might, please.

SPEAKER BROMM: Mostly I just think about cows. (Laughter)

SENATOR McDONALD: Just have to make a couple of comments for the record. And as we deal with livestock friendly, livestock is the backbone and the heart of my district, and so anything to promote livestock in my district is great.
