different punishments for the same offense. You have two different punishments when they stand alone. You have an indefinite sentence if you say the range is from one month to six months. Then you could sentence for one month, two months, three months, or whatever. But you have two separate sentences when you say the punishment shall be six months, or the punishment shall be 60 days. It's got to be one or the other. And maybe there is an explanation for that, a way to reconcile it. But when you're in the same bill, creating new offenses, new punishments, and nobody on the floor can say exactly what this bill means, this is not a bill that should be enacted into law. And again, Senator Kruse's staff is trying to answer people's questions. But is he going to be there every time an issue comes up under this bill? Is the person reading it going to have somebody to explain it? And then, I don't even agree with all the explanations given by Senator Kruse's staff, as far as the consequences of what this law would be. Whenever a law is unclear to a substantial number of the senators, it should not be passed into law, a proposed law. Why is there not a lot of debate on this? Because people just don't understand it. Again, I'm probably expected, along with Senator Bourne, Senator Synowiecki, and those who will try to grapple with it, to do the heavy lifting. Then people might say, well, maybe it won't do any harm, maybe the courts can sort through it, and maybe it will work out all right. Then a constituent is going to...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...come to you and say, this is what they told me I had done, and this is the way I should be punished, but the court did something else. Now help me. That's when you're going to look at this for the first time, and you're going to say, I don't even understand it. I don't know why the court did what it did, and I don't even know what the court should have done. I know people may be tired because of all the debating we did on the budget bill and the revenue raising bills. But we still are in session. Our responsibility to be attentive and careful is still upon us. I'm going to assume that responsibility the best that I can. And if it looks like the body is of a mind to move this bill, I'm going to have to do everything I can to impede its progress. Even though I attacked
