Thompson posed. And that's all I have. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Maxwell. Senator Foley, followed by Senator Stuhr, Chambers, and Thompson. Senator Foley.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you again, Mr. President. Senator Thompson, when Senator Raikes was responding to your question, I was speaking with someone else, so what I'm about to say might be a little bit duplicative of what he just told you. But during the hearing on this, it was pointed out that if you open up the yellow pages in the phone book you'll find quite a number of abortion providers who run quarter-page ads in the yellow pages with, obviously, phone numbers and also Internet addresses. And you go to their Internet addresses and there's full information about the judicial waiver process and you can even download the form for the judicial waiver. So there really is plenty of information available, and also bear in mind that there's nothing in this amendment that prohibits the distribution of any information. It just says you don't have to do this; you don't have to give this away pursuant to state law any longer. So I hope that adds a little bit more clarity to it. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Foley. Senator Stuhr, on the Foley amendment.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I, too, was one of the members that supported this bill that was before us. I believe that the education lobby feels that it has been a mandate. It doesn't relate actually to the academic area and would just ask for your support. Thank you.
