him, give them the information about especially...I'm worried about incest cases. I mean my focus is pretty narrow here. Is there anything that's going to prevent that from happening in a school, that that school nurse...that's...I don't know. I'm just curious.

SENATOR RAIKES: Senator, my reaction/impression would be no; that there wouldn't be anything that would prohibit a school employee, nurse or maybe even another school employee, from providing that information. This would simply say that the requirement that each school district provide this in written form before May of each year would go away.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Okay. Well, I would feel better about it knowing that that's not going to happen with this amendment then. Thank you.

SENATOR RAIKES: Um-hum.

SENATOR THOMPSON: When I was a county commissioner, we did a health needs assessment in Sarpy County and at that time we were just providing clinics for the elderly and we discovered that most of the need was for preschool children and pregnant teens. And I don't have a lot of experience with anything like this, except that I did start a program at the high school with the school nurse as a pilot to work with all pregnant and parenting teens, and the moms and the dads came out of a class. We rotated it. And I guess what I learned from that experience is how close those girls were to that school nurse, and how important she was in getting them through this difficult time in their lives. Most of the girls kept the babies, a few of them put them up for adoption, but it was a support group. And I just went along to watch and ended up going to all of their meetings throughout that semester of the pilot program. And so I just...I admit I don't...I'm not very familiar with this whole arena, but I just want to make sure that we aren't doing anything that gets in the way of that relationship where you can get good, sound information, information from a trusted individual in the school that you don't have to look up a stranger in the yellow pages for.
