SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, I'll listen.

SENATOR FOLEY: There's a sentence that...in current statute that reads: The provisions of this section shall not be construed to require a school district to provide specific information regarding how students may implement the judicial bypass provisions of Section 71-6903, and I'm told that that...we may need that sentence. And...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did you ask me a question,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...Senator Foley, because I didn't mean to be ignoring you, if you did?

SENATOR FOLEY: No, that's quite all right, Senator. I think there's some confusion on my end, to be truthful about it. We're scrambling around, trying to determine if an additional sentence is needed to your amendment, a sentence that's already in statute, and if we can get this figured out I think we're going to be able to accept your amendment and move on here. Mr. President, I'm going to turn back my time to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Foley. Senator Raikes, on the Chambers amendment. We're kind of going back and forth here.

SENATOR RAIKES: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. Senator Thompson, would you respond to a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Senator Thompson, you expressed concerns about students, who might have been victimized in a family incident or something like that, would need to have information to deal with the situation what they're in. I'm interested with the proposal that...for modification that Senator Chambers has come up with, do you think this would address the concern you raised?
