SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Byars.

SENATOR BYARS: Senator Beutler, you could be absolutely correct. We'll look at that language and we'll make correction on Select File. I really don't have a problem with what you're saying. I can see some ambiguity, so I don't have a problem with that. But let us look at it, see if there was a specific reason for that language to be there. To the best of my knowledge, that hasn't be questioned or an issue at this point, but we'll certainly look at that and make sure that that meets with your approval between now and Select File.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, thank you. There may well be a good reason for it. I haven't read the entire amendment, so...but I just would like to understand it. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Beutler and Senator Byars. Senator Jensen, you're recognized to close on the committee amendments. And he waives closing. The question then is the adoption of the committee amendments to LB 95. All in favor please vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of committee amendments.

SPEAKER BROMM: The committee amendments are adopted. Do you have anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Maxwell, you're recognized to close on the advancement of LB 95.

SENATOR MAXWELL: Thank you, Mr. President. This will be brief. Just a quick reminder, LB 95 itself is a bill that says, in a case of miscarriage resulting from a confirmed pregnancy, where the remains can be identified by the naked eye, the parents have the right to claim the remains, to direct that the remains be sent to a funeral home rather than disposed of as medical waste,
