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acts. I know that the administration, the Revenue Department, and my own staff, have been monitoring the situation. We'll act as carefully as we can to make sure that we adjust for anything that we can.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you very much.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Beutler and Senator Landis. Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I rise to support the committee amendments and the bill. I think one of the things we talked about...because we're sometimes...served on the Revenue Committee for a long time...frustrated by changes that they make in the federal law that we have to changes here. Why don't we just separate it completely? Well, if we want to add a lot of workers to our body, we could do that. So I guess I just rise to make that part of the record, that it's...we'd have to add people if we went a long ways away from what we're doing right now. We kind of...Senator Landis had moved away...a little ways away from it with...when Senator...Governor Orr was in...was Governor. Thank you. And I support the amendment and the bill.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. Senator Raikes. Is Senator Raikes in the Chamber? Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. President, members, I was just going to provide some comments for Senator Beutler's edification. The provision that we're talking about, I think you're referring to...according to my information, I heard Senator Landis say something about the House, but the provision is included only in the Senate bill, and the House included no fiscal relief in its reconciliation bill. And the two bills will conferenced soon, quote. So I don't know whether there's any dependability in that relief. I don't know if Senator Landis has any more comments. That's all I'm referring to. Thank you. And Senator Landis may have my time if he desires any more time, Senator Bromm.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. You have four
