spent only for education. And to the extent that there might be more money there than is necessary for education, the Appropriations Committee can deal with that next time around. And likewise, with regard to the Dispute Resolution Cash Fund, it limits its purpose to dispute resolution matters, and makes one exception, makes one exception. It says, with regard to the library, to the library here in the Capitol building, that some of that money can be used...or, through the mechanism of the bill, money can be used to be sure that that library stays open. The Appropriations Committee in the second year of the biennium did not supply sufficient funding to keep the library open and operating on a level...didn't supply the money to keep it operating at all, for all practical purposes, in the second year. So the amendment would allow the payment for operating costs for the library. The sum total of the amendment is that it tightens down a little bit the uses of the money, with the hope that the Appropriations Committee will then have the opportunity to scrutinize the spending of the money, as it should, next time around. And it may decide to allow all that money to continue to be used for the purposes of the cash fund, or it may decide to transfer it, a matter to be negotiated with the Supreme Court when it comes time for the next budget discussions. But it at least ensures that that money will not be spent for other operational purposes before we get around to that future discussion. And with that, I have the amendment, and I'll substitute it for the amendment that is pending.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, did you wish to withdraw the amendment you had previously introduced?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Pardon me?

SENATOR CUDABACK: You're asking to withdraw the amendment you previously introduced, correctly?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, I am.

SENATOR CUDABACK: That is withdrawn.
