SENATOR CUDABACK: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Beutler would move to amend.
(AM2004, Legislative Journal page 1912.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, to open on Amendment...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I won't go...

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...2004.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...I won't go through the explanation again. I gave you the sum and substance of the amendment. It tightens down on the ability of the court system to spend the money for any purpose, to the purposes which they originally defined in their bills for the expenditure of the money, with the exception that it allows some of the money to be spent for the State Library, in order to keep it going as it has operated, pretty much, until the next biennium arrives. And then the Appropriations Committee can look at the matter further in a couple of years and make recommendations to you. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You've heard the opening on AM2004, offered by Senator Beutler to LB 760. Now open for discussion on that amendment. Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, members of the body, I don't know as I rise in enthusiastic support, or anything approaching it, of Senator Beutler's amendment. But it's okay. (Laugh) Now having had an opportunity to review it, it is as he represented it. I believe it's consistent with the objectives he set forth. And I will vote in favor of its adoption. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Beutler, there are no further lights on. Did you wish to close on AM2004?
