SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Landis.

I think that with respect to the suggested program that is before us and is apparently the principal centerpiece of this bill, that is a small rural program for 25,000 and under, I don't think any of us have a big problem with that. What concerns me, I guess, is that the people of the state and the people in this Legislature and everybody this year thought we were dealing principally with LB 775 and that that was what this bill was all about. And we worked very hard on General File to get some wage...minimum wage provisions in there and some other things related to LB 775. Could you succinctly tell us, and I'm afraid it's going to be too succinct, what's left in this bill with respect to LB 775?

SPEAKER BROMM: I was going to say that was it, but why don't I let Senator Landis describe that, because that is the component of the bill that he's more familiar with than I am.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Is that okay, Senator Beutler? I'll be happy to tell you what's in the bill and what's not.
