trying to reverse this process before a number of years pass. Many of those came to us, I think, after we started the session and said, if the Legislature has the courage to put this thing in a position to pass next year, we'll go out and we'll try to find out where the people are at later this summer and early this fall, and see whether there's support for repealing term limits or not. But we don't want to spend our time and effort circulating petitions and putting it on the ballot in that fashion. If the Legislature feels that it's a bad policy for the state, we want to see the Legislature demonstrate willingness to put this in a position to be put on the ballot if the support is there for repealing it. So I have mixed emotions about what we ought to do here. I...people can say whatever they want about self-serving, and that's fine. I'm not going to be affected by term limits. I've said that before, and I'll say it again. And my reason for wanting to put this on the ballot, if there is public support for looking at repealing it, has nothing to do with my own political future. I will not stay longer than term limits would allow me to stay. Now, having said that, I think when the time comes to vote on this, whether it's today or down the line, my vote is going to be cast simply for what I think is in the best interests of the people of the state. And we're going to face several of those votes yet this session. And what I think is best for the people of the state might be different than what some of you think is best. And that's okay. As long as you vote what you think is best for the people of the state, you've got nothing to apologize for. You've got nothing to be ashamed of. And anybody that questions me or you when we get home, we have a very good answer for them. I did what I thought was best for the people of the state. They do not have to...if this ever gets on the ballot again, they do not have to support it. It's not a slap in the face to give them another chance to think about it. This thing was passed when the country was in a wave of term limit paranoia. The stampede was on. The support for this came from outside the state. They found some spokesmen inside the state. They didn't raise much money inside the state. Their money came from outside the state. And it will again. And I don't make any apologies at all for however I vote on this. Term limit as a concept is absolutely the worst idea for the state of Nebraska you could have. We have very little continuity in this state, and the
