the discussion in here before about how it will impact a unicameral more than a bicameral. And I'm not going to go into that any more. But I think if we don't act on this measure and put it back on the ballot, it will be as if we have been intimidated by a few people. And I don't think we should let that happen. Also, I might say to you that this is a constitutional amendment we're talking about. It's not like that seat belt initiative that took place several years back that the Legislature came back and undid. In that case, the seat belt was a statutory initiative, and so the Legislature came back and simply did away with that seat belt provision. We're not doing that. All we're saying is, we think we ought to give the voters another chance to talk about it and to decide. We can't make that final decision. And I don't want anybody out there in Nebraska to think that we're going to make the final decision. We're not. They are. It takes about 110,000 signatures to put such an amendment on the ballot. And it could be done. But I would rather see the effort and the energy go into having a real viable and good campaign about this issue, rather than in trying to gather the signatures. If term limits is such a great idea, why don't we impose term limits on every elective office in Nebraska? Senator Schrock, I think, is the one who said it to me earlier. If we imposed term limits on the NRDs and the county commissioners and the city councils and the county sheriffs and,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...you name it, we'd impose it, I think people would realize very quickly why that wasn't a good idea. So I have no problem if we follow Senator Chambers' suggestion and don't advance it today. But I for one am going to advance it. I think it would be the better policy to advance it and let it sit on Final Reading over the summer, when you have a chance to have that conversation with your constituents. It will be no different than if we just leave it sitting here on Select File today. As you all know, we have a process for pulling a bill back from Final Reading if we need to pull a bill back from Final Reading. So I would encourage your vote to advance this bill to Final Reading.
