not from the standpoint of the right of an individual to hold an office, but on the basis of the right of the people to vote for whomever they choose. But that is some research that I am currently engaging in. And it's aside from the point that is before us today. Senator Schimek and Senator Bromm, I agree that we ought to forthrightly confront issues and plough right through them. But this is a different type of issue. It is one which requires delicate handling, of the kind I am not adept at doing. But I'm trying. I don't want to put my colleagues in a position of doing something which they will regret. Act in haste, repent at leisure. So when it appears that everybody has spoken who desires to do so, I...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...will offer this motion to bracket. And the body does not have to accept that. It's just a proposal, like anything else put on the desk. Putting it on the desk does not guarantee its passage. Nor does my offering it mean that I have tapped the pulse of the body and have determined that this is the direction the body wants to go. I won't know that until the body expresses its will. However, I do believe the Legislature has an obligation collectively, the legislators individually, to give the public the benefit of our judgment, our experience, our knowledge about how this system works. And whether it seems self-serving or anything else, we still must do the thing that appears to each of us to be appropriate. I think the appropriate thing would be to move this bill. However, it...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...takes a majority, and more than a bare majority, in my opinion. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Tyson.

SENATOR TYSON: Thank you, member...Mr. President, members of the body. If a bracket motion is filed, I'm going to vote against it. I think we should advance this to Final. And I'll tell you the reason why. Senator Schimek noted that there was
