SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SPEAKER BROMM: We hear from those who are...who have very, very strong feelings about term limits, in terms of supporting term limits. But at least in the town hall meetings that I've had in my district this session, those people are outnumbered four and five to one by those who say, why in the world do we have term limits, and how can we get rid of it, and things like that. So we'll find out more certainly how the people really feel if we're willing to at least stick our necks out far enough to advance this one time, and let it sit, to get that information. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Dwite Pedersen, followed by Senator Engel.

SENATOR Dw. PEDERSEN: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. The last time you voted on this from General File, I was not here. Was an evening that I had to work. If I were here, I would have voted for it to advance it. This is not a job; this is a service. We volunteer our time to serve the people of the state, specifically the people of our districts. I have spoke to people who said, thank God for term limits; you're out of there one way or the other. If you want us out of here, vote us out. We'll pick up our things and go home. And I don't know of one of us in here that wouldn't be better off financially. And in most cases emotionally. I've been here 11 years now, and I've really enjoyed the job. I find it an honor and a privilege to serve. But I come here, chosen by the people, to make decisions that I think is best with the information given me, and what I think is better...best for the state in the future and in the present. It would not be a bad thing at all for me not to win an election. When I first was elected my first election, I was an outsider, never been in for a political office before in my life.
