SENATOR BEUTLER: ...that we would set up individually.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right. And your intention is for it to be fiscally neutral?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Although I'm thinking there would have to be some money for administration that probably is now being absorbed within DAS.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, we could look at that, Senator, in a couple of years, if we wanted to, and maybe add some money. But to me, the value of having a second...having a separate focus and people assigned to do just that job is worth spending a little less money there overall and keep the allocation of resources a simple reallocation and not adding money, that is, that that that makes up for spending a little less money. The more direct focus makes up for spending a little less money.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: In the immediate future, at least,...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...talking about. So your idea is that in order...this would be truly absorbed within the present budget, even though some of that might be eaten up with administration in the...particularly these first two years. But in order to have that focus down the road. Now, this is an appointee by the Governor then?

SENATOR BEUTLER: This would be appointed by the Governor, yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. And...

SENATOR BEUTLER: And hopefully, with this kind of focus, you could go out and start a real process of getting private money involved. I think there are loads of people out there in the state of Nebraska who, if rightly approached, would be willing to start setting up endowment funds or capital improvement
