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funds, and work with the administrator of the Capitol building. I'm thinking, Senator, that whatever monies might be lost by just simply splitting off the resources would be gained in short time by the focused effort they can make for private money.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Now, is the transfer occur in this bill, just setting up a separate budget, does that occur in this bill?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. And do you know what the dollars that you're transferring at this point?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I can give that to you. I do have that. But I don't remember the numbers off hand. But I'll just pass along to you the note.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right. I'll probably support this. I'm going to look at it a little more carefully...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...over the next few days. But I agree with the end product. The means is what I'm...I want to be sure I understand. That's...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Senator Mines.

SENATOR MINES: Thank you, Mr. President, colleagues. I just realized that there must be food in the back room. I haven't been paying attention to who's in the body, but I respect their right to go eat. I would ask Senator Beutler to yield, please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, would you yield?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes.
