SENATOR MINES: Right. And then this would be a new position, and would be appointed by the Governor, and then would be responsible to the Governor?

SENATOR BEUTLER: The Governor.

SENATOR MINES: So they would be part of the Governor's Office? The Governor would sign their check? They wouldn't be responsible to any other agency, simply the Governor?

SENATOR BEUTLER: That's right.

SENATOR MINES: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: The input here, or the other influence here, Senator, is the Nebraska Capitol Commission itself. And if you glance through the bill, you'll see that on a significant number of kinds of decisions that are important to Nebraskans, they're asked for advisory opinions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I mean, the Office of the Administrator makes the decision. The Office of the Administrator is controlled ultimately by the Governor. But they're working with recommendations in some cases from the Nebraska Capitol Commission.
