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doing all the rewiring projects on this building. We've raised the money to redo our hallways and bring them up to date. We've got several offices that have been redone over the years through the Legislature. We have raised that money and we got the projects done, of course, under the guidance, it has to be under the guidance of the Building Committee. But the thing is we did that and I think so we should be part...we should be part of this process. So I do believe, and this is how it should be, each representative from all branches, and the Governor still, like Senator Beutler said, the Governor still has a say-so. He still picks that administrator, but at least he has a little more guidance as far as who is appointed, and he still makes the final decision. So we're not taking away anybody's power. It's just a matter of more cooperation and more input. So I think this is a good bill, this is a very good amendment, and I certainly would appreciate everybody supporting both. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Engel. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. I turned my light on for two reasons and one, I don't think I thanked Senator Hudkins earlier for allowing us to hold her bill for a while so that we could work out some of these things and get some answers for people. And so I want to thank her for that. The second thing I wanted to do is have a little conversation with Senator Beutler, because I wasn't sure that I understood what he said about the questions about taking in funds. And so I recall that there was a provision in law that has a fund created so that we could take in money for the Capitol and Capitol kinds of projects, so I wanted to carry that discussion just a little bit further. And, Senator Beutler, would you just explain a little bit again, or elaborate on what you said before, about what you were trying to convey about the foundation and the fund and so on and so forth?

SPEAKER BROMM: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes. The Capitol building doesn't have a foundation set up, a 501(c)(3) foundation,...
