SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Senator Brashear or Senator Hartnett, would you have any problems with an amendment to additionally allow an inmate to undertake inpatient treatment at his or her expense while incarcerated? I assume all of these have to be by the approval of the sentencing court. Is that...

SENATOR BRASHEAR: That is correct. I mean this all has to be a governed process and procedure. There's no reason to oppose an amendment that would allow an individual to have inpatient treatment at their own expense.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: So is that something that potentially we could, between General File and Select File, add to the bill, Senator Brashear?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Absolutely. We can certainly work through that.
