SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: S-t-e-a-k.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. How did you happen to get a copy of that, Senator Schimek?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I just used my gadget.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, thank you. Members of the Legislature, here's why I'm offering the amendment. Anything that can serve to bring attention to the office of protocol I think should be done. This is the only specific item that will be added to this activity that we're undertaking, this new title and duty that we're giving to the Secretary of State. And I think it makes sense. I don't think it would hurt anything. And as a matter of fact, it might even bring some attention and notoriety to the office of the Secretary of State, which, up until now, does not exist. I don't believe there are many people, other than those who might file for corporations and some people who file other documents that have to be put in that office, who even know what the Secretary of State does. But I think there's something that comes into the mind of anybody who would hear the title "Secretary of Steak." I think it's appropriate for Nebraska. We've just moved a bill that talks about livestock friendly counties. This would show that Nebraska is a livestock friendly state. So I'm going to see what my colleagues think about this particular amendment. And you'll notice, I did not laugh the whole time that I'm speaking. I'm only smiling now because Senator Mines is smiling at me, and I tend to respond to people the way they present themselves to me. But consider it before you discard it. How could this hurt anything? Thank you, Mr. President.
