of those multimillion dollar credits are given out in accordance with our statutes. It's a very, very important question because there is a very, very large amount of money involved. I think I will stop there, Senator. Thank you.

SENATOR ENGEL: Thank you, Senator Beutler, and that was your third time. Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Mr. President, members of the body, so there you have it. I'm not ashamed. I don't think that the legislative branch of government wants to get into individual taxpayer information under whatever guise and for whatever purpose motivated by whatever reason. I do hold the executive branch of government and the leadership of the executive branch of government responsible for the appropriate operation of the Department of Revenue. And there is a whole and huge body of law, and I do not recall any scandals coming out of our Department of Revenue of late. I don't know that they've needed the help of any individual legislator who does or doesn't sit on the Legislative Program Evaluation Committee to lead them in doing their job in accordance with his or her reasons. And I don't think this body ought to go there. Every taxpayer is under penalty of civil and criminal fraud, individual or otherwise; somebody who claims the exemptions for children, somebody who claims homestead exemptions, somebody who claims interest exemptions, dividends are much in the news, that relates to individuals. And I'm just as concerned that any individual pays their taxes correctly as any corporation. We're trying to label here big, big, big. It's an interesting time to be labeling big and denigrating it at a time when we haven't got enough revenue to cover the money we want to appropriate and spend for the benefit of all the people. And we want to send a chill out there that, oh, we said we'd do LB 775 or any other economic development incentive on a confidential basis. We've got a business friendly climate. We want you to come to Nebraska. We want you to create jobs. We want you to employ people. We want you to pay the wages you can pay in the marketplace and still stay in business. Some people are laying off a lot of workers because they aren't making enough money in the operation of their business and families are out of jobs because workers are being laid off in this economy.
