manner, but I do want to go over AM1484 briefly and point out some of the major portions. We talk about the do not call list and its impact. I would say the best thing about AM1484 is it establishes the fact that Nebraska will recognize the federal list. So that we are not setting up a bureaucracy at the state level for a do not call list by requiring a subscription fee and a lot of different avenues in state government, but we still use the Public Service Commission as the governing authority, so to speak, in overseeing the fact that Nebraska does effectively have a do not call list but it uses that federal list. So that is a major thrust of AM1484. And I'm sure that many of you have been contacted about the charitable organizations, and there's been a request for an all-out exemption of charitable organizations and that's been a point that I've investigated and tried to realize should we offer an all-out exemption or should we consider what is in AM1484, and that is the fact that charitable organizations can still call their members. They can still call their donors, and they can still call their alumni. And so in many respects, there is already an exemption for charitable organizations. Certainly that does not meet the request of several charitable organizations. But the reason why that I...the reason why I did not want to accept a blanket exemption is the fact that charitable organizations present themselves in rather creative ways these days. And as I checked through my e-mail, voice mail, certainly voice mail would be relevant to this situation, I'm finding that there is a charitable organization, for example, that contracts with for-profit companies to...that seeks to consolidate debt that I don't even have. But, nonetheless, they have tried to call me on numerous times, and those are automated phone calls, that I'm hesitant to call back and say don't call me again because then they will take my number and sell it to someone else and say, hey, this person responded so they are a target, and all in the name of charitable organizations. So that's why, though, I did not want to accept a full blanket of exemption for charitable organizations. But it's been an interesting dialogue. I've asked the question of anyone wanting exemption, because it is not just charitable organizations, but of anyone wanting exemption I asked the question why do you want to call someone who doesn't want to be called. And at least one charitable organization was honest with me and said that they like to
