here we haven't thought through, but what this amendment says is that the commission shall create informational materials with regard to the do not call registry, including notice of the availability of the National Do Not Call Registry, its connection to the state do not call registry, and how to be placed on both registries, and an explanation of the overlapping jurisdictions of the state and federal registries and when each applies, and the action a consumer should take if the consumer continues to receive unwanted telephone solicitations after requesting to be replaced...to be placed on either or both of the registries, including specific instructions explaining how and when to contact the Federal Trade Commission or the Public Service Commission to seek enforcement of the applicable law and regulations. And, secondly, each provider of residential telephone service in Nebraska shall annually provide the informational materials to every residential subscriber. Then the amendment has a couple of technical provisions. It also goes on to provide that with respect to a residential subscriber that has requested not to be called, who has specifically requested not to be called, that that...that the company then must abide by that request. The last thing, the last significant thing that the amendment does is to increase the fine from \$2,500 in the Smith amendment to \$7,000. At the national level, the fine is \$12,000. When we had this bill on General File, you approved the \$7,000 level of fine. Senator Smith has dropped it once again in this amendment to \$2,500. I think \$7,000, which is halfway between what he is suggesting and the federal fine level is a level that will deter people. I don't know that a level so low as \$2,500 will be as effective. So I think the fine should have a little more weight to it. That's basically what's in the amendment, and I would be glad to try to answer your questions. Thank you.
