Chase Manhattan Bank in New York, and they would contact you about consolidation of debt services and so on. That was a nonprofit. And it probably was a nonprofit organization, but they were getting their funding through selling these lists they were gathering to a bank in New York. I didn't appreciate it a lot. I will say this for them, though, they were very straightforward and up front with me as to who they were. So I think the bill, as drafted, the amendment as drafted now, which is the bill, does allow for legitimate nonprofits. We don't want to exempt them, in my mind, but legitimate nonprofits still have the ability to call if you're...they are calling an affiliation, affiliated member, alumnus, or an existing contributor. So there is going to be a lot of discussion. I'm trying to study Senator Beutler's amendment here. I think I'm going to have to oppose it in principle here. It raises the fine back up to \$7,000, which we thought was too high on General File and agreed with various entities and the lobby to get that down. There is some other things. I'm afraid if we accept this, Senator Bourne, I do not accept the statement you made that it's a contributing factor, bills like this, to a tax increase. There isn't any General Fund money goes in this. We took the fee out of it for the consumers. I don't buy that statement whatsoever. This has no factor as far as General Fund money. I am concerned a little bit, and I have to look at Senator Beutler's amendment a little further, as to what it might cost for the Public Service Commission to set out these guidelines and so on. One of the reasons we need this bill is that federal no-call list does not include intrastate calls, does not...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...include intrastate calls. It also has a complete exemption for charitable organizations and those are the two big issues why we do need this bill. It does not require any tax and no General Fund money, and the way the amendment is written right now, I don't think there will be any A bill with it at any time. So I want to caution people, and when you hear that someone says we don't need this because of the federal no-call list, there is a tremendous amount of difference between what we have proposed in AM1484 and what the
