certainly legitimate. So, again, I rise in opposition to AM1972. I would entertain some parts of this in terms of making the bill better, but I really think I'm already being criticized for being too restrictive but certainly I don't want to be even more restrictive with adding to the penalties that already, I think, are attention getting at \$2,5000. Thank you, Madam President.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Smith. The next speaker is Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Smith, let me ask you to take us through this a little bit because I think it might be helpful to people to understand how this is going to work. If I'm a citizen and I want to get on the Nebraska no-call list, what will I do?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Senator Smith, would you yield?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes, Madam President. Senator Beutler, it would...a lot of these details would be worked out by the Public Service Commission as set out in the bill. So I'm not sure I'd be able to provide you with the exact details for administrating that...or administering that provision. But they're...I've already had some feedback from the Public Service Commission in terms of being able to let consumers know what their options are without a mandate here in the bill. I don't want to create a greater burden for the PSC than that would already exist with some of the advertising mandates here in the amendment. So, I mean they could place some suggestions or outlines in their other materials that are already available. They already have several mechanisms in place.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, Senator, I'm just asking you to describe what the basic process would be. I'm a citizen, I want to get on the no-call list, what do I do?

SENATOR SMITH: Right, you would call the number that is established by the federal list, and then those...that same list would apply to callers inside Nebraska. I mean Senator Bourne has suggested that we don't need this because of the federal
