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applicable to the local calls within the state, that will give the consumer protection then both from telemarketer calls outside the state and from telemarketing calls inside the state. So I think you need to have not two lists, just one list, but a list that will be shared and a list that will be effective for both kinds of calls,...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...and that's all that Senator...that's all that Senator Smith is suggesting. And you may think that you want one...calls from one type of people and not from another, et cetera, et cetera. Every individual makes a decision. You know if you're going to be on a no-call list that certain types of calls will not come to you. If that's what you want, you put your name on the list. On the other hand, if you want to get certain types of calls that will be prevented by being on the no-call list, you simply don't sign up. You don't get on the list. Maybe even someday it will be more sophisticated and you can take certain types of calls and not others. But the public would like to have that basic choice I assure you, and I think it's a choice that should be made available to them and it should not be a function of buying an additional technology to have the basic fundamental right of not being called by commercial interests. Sure, we can..

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Time.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...go out and pay for more, but they shouldn't be allowed to do that, and I'd withdraw the amendment, Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. I will raise the call at this point. Next item, Mr. Clerk.
